

# **IC 2025 REGISTRATION & WAITLIST POLICIES**

BBYO International Convention 2025 is expected to sell out, potentially within the first few hours of registration being open. Therefore, we encourage AZA and BBG members to register as early as possible.

## **PRIORITY REGISTRATION (October 8, 2024)**

For those who qualify, priority registration will be open on October 8, 2024, between 9:00 AM—9:00 PM ET. Teens will receive an email with a unique link to register that cannot be shared. Sharing the link may result in losing access to IC. Anyone registering who is not eligible will be removed from registration.

IC priority registration will be available for:

- BBYO Summer 2024 Camp Leadership (CLTC, ILTC, and International Kallah) attendees who registered for summer before March 15, 2024
- Regional presidents
- RMR teen members who have confirmed and completed all necessary steps to be a Global Ambassadors Week home host by September 30
- IC Steering Leadership (exact positions to be posted)

### **GENERAL REGISTRATION (October 9, 2024)**

Only BBYO members in good standing may register for IC. If you are not yet a member, you may join at <a href="mailto:bbyo.org/join">bbyo.org/join</a>.

- For Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and the Former Soviet Union, registration will open October 9 at 8:00 PM CET
- For North America, Latin America, the Asia Pacific region, and Australia, registration will open October 9 at 8:00 PM ET

IC 2025 registration closes on January 13, 2025 (pending space availability).

#### WAITLIST

If/when IC registration meets capacity, the registration system will stop accepting registrations and we will move to a waitlist form, which will capture a date and time stamp for each waitlist registration. The date and time stamp will determine rankings on the waitlist.

If space becomes available, the next ranked person (based on the characteristics of the space available) will be invited to register and will have 48 hours to do so.



There will be spaces held for global and Canadian teens on registration night. After those spaces are filled, teens will go on a waitlist for their country availability.

There will be rooms/floors designated for AZA, BBG, and BBYO members. Once those rooms have been filled, those teens will be placed on a waitlist. This means, for example, that we could have a waitlist for BBGs, but not Alephs, depending on how rooms are filled.

Prioritization for inviting teens off the waitlist to register will work as follows:

- In general:
  - AZA, BBG, or BBYO member availability: per capacity numbers in the sleeping rooms
  - Wednesday vs. Thursday arrival: do we have a room for their arrival on the night requested
  - o Global, Canadian and United States teen available spots
- And then, based on ranking of registration on waitlist from time stamp

#### **SIGHTSEEING**

Delegates will also select their top 10 choices for their Sunday sightseeing activity at the time of registration. Most sightseeing options will be included in the IC registration cost. There will be a handful of programs that have an additional fee, which will be noted in the options. These choices may be edited after registration is complete until October 22. At that time, BBYO will be doing assignments—we will try our best to give each delegate one of their top choices, based on availability.
